Subject: Update on TransCanada's Proposed Vaughan Mainline Expansion Project

TransCanada hosted a Public Open House on May 13, 2015 to share information about the proposed Vaughan Mainline Expansion (VME) Project (<http://www.transcanada.com/vaughan-mainline.html>). We understand that not everyone who is interested in the project may have been able to attend the event. As such, we would like to take this opportunity to share some of the highlights and feedback received during the Open House and, at the same time, provide an update on the project.

Approximately 22 people attended the Open House, representing a range of interests including landowners, municipal staff, local residents, and community and environmental groups. The Open House was advertised in local newspapers including Lo Speccio, Vaughan Citizen, Thornhill Liberal, Corriere Canadese and the Richmond Hill Liberal. Invitations were mailed to nearly 2000 residents and other interested stakeholders. During the Open House, TransCanada introduced the project and presented information on subjects including: the proposed route; pipeline integrity and maintenance; environmental assessment activities; and, how to provide input into the development of the project. The project team was available to answer questions and receive comments. Representatives from the Ontario Ministry of Transportation's GTA West Project were also in attendance to answer any questions regarding their project.

Feedback provided during the Open House focused primarily on specific property impacts to landowners. In addition, some common questions were posed related to pipeline safety and integrity measures, environmental impacts, and general impacts of the proposed GTA West transportation corridor.

In response to the feedback received to date, the project team is continuing to work with landowners, municipalities and other agencies to refine the proposed route. TransCanada will continue to keep you apprised of information about the proposed project. As a further project update please be advised that the targeted in-service date for the project is now Q2 2017.

We look forward to continuing to engage with interested stakeholders and ensuring that feedback is gathered and incorporated in a meaningful manner. If you have any questions or comments on the project or schedule please do not hesitate to contact us.
