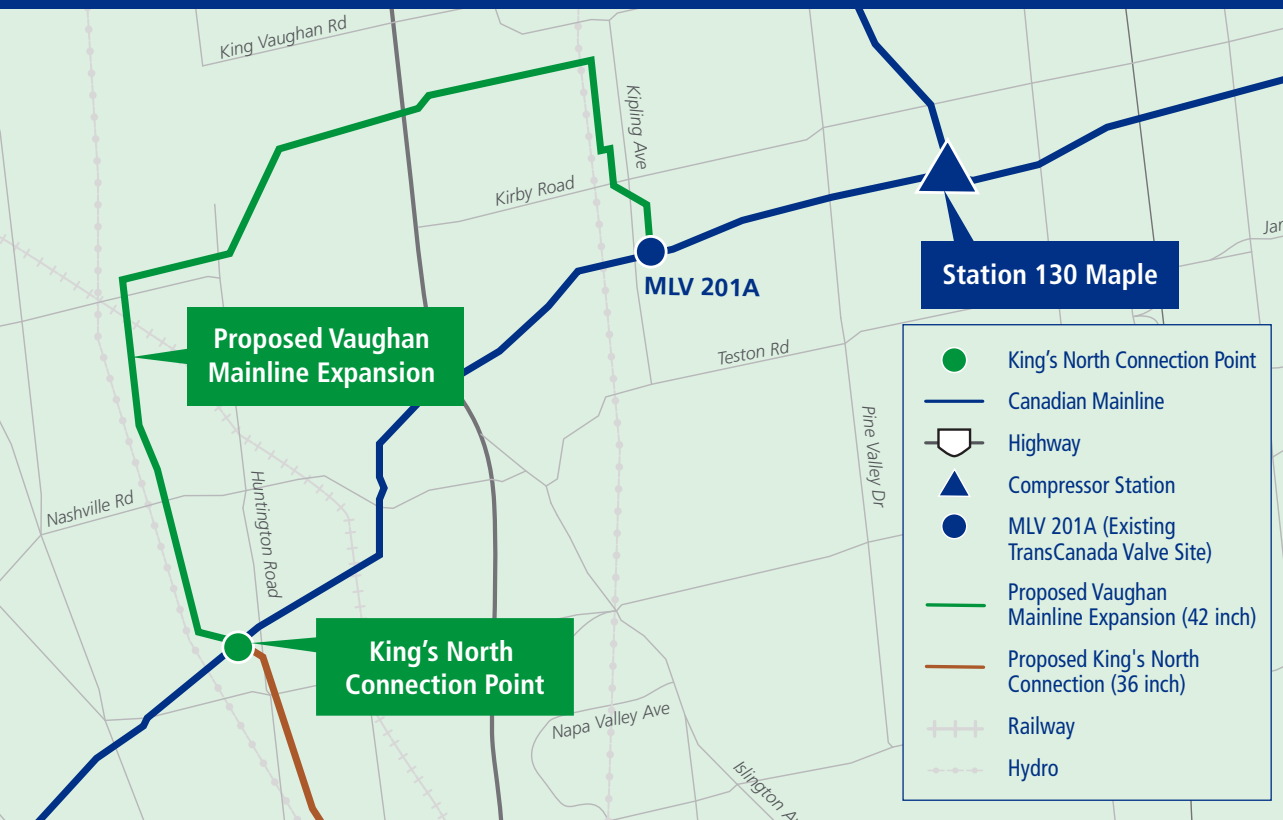

The Proposed Project

TransCanada is proposing to construct, own and operate a new natural gas transmission pipeline in the City of Vaughan in order to continue to provide homes, businesses, schools and hospitals in Ontario and Eastern Canada with a safe and reliable source of natural gas.

The project is being proposed to address customer demand for natural gas in Ontario and Eastern Canada markets. The proposed project will provide improved access to new natural gas supplies from the U.S. Northeast.

The Vaughan Mainline Expansion Project will be integrated into TransCanada's existing Canadian Mainline system in the City of Vaughan upon completion. The proposed project will include the construction of approximately 12 km of 42-inch diameter pipe for the purpose of transporting natural gas.

In addition to improved access to natural gas, the project will also provide financial benefits to the City of Vaughan through local spending during construction and through annual property tax payments and community partnerships and investments.

TransCanada will be engaging with landowners, municipal officials, First Nation and Métis communities and organizations, and other stakeholders as part of the engagement process. Feedback from consultation in addition to environmental and engineering studies will be taken into consideration as part of the application to the National Energy Board (NEB). TransCanada anticipates filing an application with the NEB in Q3 2015.
